

Getting started with the SAFE & CARE and FRIPRO web application

Welcome to your Getting Started Guide. This guide will help you get started with the web application quickly. The interface is designed to be intuitive, with clear visual cues to help you navigate and manage rosters. The features on this page cover the basics you'll need to get up and running. We've broken it down into five simple steps to help you start processing rosters right away.

SAFE & CARE

Step 1: Login to the SAFE & CARE web application

To access the web application, you'll need to create login credentials. This is only possible after receiving an account invitation from the SAFE & CARE web application administrators. Once you receive the invitation email, you can set up your password and log in.

If you don't see an invitation email after your license purchase, contact your Administrator.

Step 2 (conditional): Select the SAFE & CARE instance

If your organization has licenses for both SAFE & CARE and FRIPRO, you may see two buttons allowing you to choose between these instances, based on your access permissions. Select the SAFE & CARE instance.

Instance buttons not showing?

This step only applies to organizations that have licensed both SAFE & CARE and FRIPRO. Most users will be logged directly into whichever model they have licensed.

FRI^{PRO}
